

Each year Mama opened a "*Christmas*" *Club*" account at the bank.

Throughout the year she would deposit a few dollars each pay period. At the end of the year she would receive a check from the bank for the amount that she had saved. She would use this money to buy Christmas gifts, food, and maybe a strand of lights for Daddy to hang up on the porch.

Years later, my wife, Debra, decided to do it just a bit differently. She would find bargains throughout the year. Perhaps it was a cup that said, "*World's greatest Dad*", or a tee shirt that said, "*I love you, Mom*". Throughout the year she placed these items in her "*Christmas Box*". It would be an investment of \$2.00 here or \$3.00 there. When they opened up the "*Dollar Tree*" and sold everything for \$1.00, Debra filled up our "*Christmas Box*"! At the end of the year, we would wrap our treasures and present them to our family. Our first Christmas together was 1981. She bought an ornament with that year's date and placed it in her "*Christmas Box*". We were thrilled to hang it on our tree!

As the years went by we were able to budget a little more for Christmas. Instead of getting Daddy a pack of Beechnut chewing tobacco, we were able to get him a whole carton! One Christmas we got him a brand new pair of Liberty overalls! He was so happy to get them, but I think he was just as happy when he opened the pack of Beechnut a few years earlier!

Debra still has her "*Christmas Box*". She had to get a separate one to store the annual ornaments. This year was our 43rd Christmas together. She could decorate the entire tree and half the living room with just the annual ornaments!

The Christmas Budget and the "*Christmas Box*" has gone through changes, but it still remains one of the things that Debra enjoys the most. In the early 900s, just 900 years after Jesus was born, Wenceslas was born in Bohemia, in modern Czechoslovakia.



His father, Duke Ratislav, was a Czech ruler. He gave Wenceslas a good education.

When his father died, Wenceslas' mother took over the sate of affairs. She mishandled everything! Wenceslas stepped in to handle the reins. He was only 18 years old!

From the beginning, he proved to be a different sort of king. He sought good relations with the surrounding nations. He took steps to reform the judicial system keeping the power of judges at a point where cases were solved more fairly. He encouraged the building of churches and showed heart-felt concern for the poor. It was reported that he cut firewood for orphans and widows and carried it to them on his own shoulders through the snow!

On September 28th, 929, he was on his way to church when his brother, Boleslav, murdered him! The people of Czechoslovakia still honor Wenceslas today as a national hero.

The Song is actually a poem set to music. The first verse begins the story:

"Good King Wenceslas looked out on the Feast of Stephen,

When the snow lay round about, deep and crisp and even.

Brightly shone the moon that night, though the frost was cruel,

When a poor man came in sight, gathering winter fuel"

The Song goes on to talk about how Wenceslas helped the poor man and taught the lesson, "You who now will bless the poor shall yourselves find blessing"!

Remember, Jesus said, "... Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me." Matthew 25:10
